Ps Richard Moors's Message

We live in a different world.

Ok, that statement does not sound so radical these days. Since March this year the world as we have known it has changed dramatically, and we can't be sure what it will look like when



we come out the other side. But long before this we were recognising that the world around us had changed. I have been attending the Intergenerate conference this week online, and a couple of people have referred to a comment made by Jake Mulder "The church is calibrated to a world that no longer exists." Even prior to Covid19 the world around us was different to the world which many in the church grew up in and thought was around them.

This became particularly clear to me a couple of years ago when I was in the Upper Hunter. We were hosting a Youth For Christ Auslife seminar in the high school. For this to happen we had people from the local church come along as small group leaders. During one of the discussion times there were questions around "Who is God?" After each session we had a feedback time for the group leaders, and one of the older members of my congregation mentioned that he was shocked that the young people in his group didn't have answers for who is God. For me that was no shock, but He thought that everyone would have an answer about who God is. Having spent years working with young people I recognise that when we talk about faith we are usually starting from the basics, we cannot assume that young people have a knowledge of any Bible stories, or that Jesus is any more than a swear word to them.



And the reason that I say that we lived in a changed world is that that is true for most people. Why is that? Well you might think about it in this way. In the 50s/60s most kids went to Sunday school. It was the done thing and their parents went to church. In the 70s/80s decent numbers went to Sunday school, but for a significant number of these their parents dropped them off at Sunday School, because it had been significant in their upbringing, but the parents did not go to church themselves. In the 90s and beyond when those kids became parents they had disconnected from the church and they did not send their children to Sunday School. So we have around us a couple of generations who are totally disconnected from the church.

This needs to impact what we do as a church. When we reach out to people we can see it as a mission opportunity. We are speaking to a culture which is different to the one that we find in the church. But not only do they not have the Bible stories, but they have different priorities. A few years ago I attended a course with Andrew Root. He pointed out that sociologists suggest that there are five main parts to culture. In the past the biggest was family, then religion, while society, economy and government were fairly small. That is probably how most in the church view things. But the world around us has changed. By far the largest now is economy we focus on getting stuff. Then it is society, people are focused on their status. Then government and family, and religion is tiny. It is not that people are necessarily against religions, it just not seem very important to them. This means that we need to change how we talk. We need to help them to see why it is important, not just why our faith is the right one.

It is important for us to be aware that the world around us has changed. That we need to sing God's song in a new land, and that means that we need to do things differently. This is not just true for young people, but for most of our community. It is why we are looking at new ways of doing things as Southside Uniting. That we may reach this community around us with the amazing news of God's love and acceptance.

Our Worshipping Future at Southside UC

As COVID-19 restrictions begin to be eased by government and our UC synod, our ministry team, church council and this coming week - Worship Ministry Area are part of a broad discernment for both:

- the shape of worship across our four centres medium long term; e.g. what is the necessary connection between our worshiping and Missional life?
- planning for the first services where our people, albeit in adjusted ways, can regather in our worship spaces. There is a keenness for this to happen, but many factors need to be considered sanitisation, attendance recording, distancing and music being among these.

This Tuesday 23 June, from 2 - 3.30 pm, members of the Ministry Team and folk from the Worship Ministry Area are meeting online via Zoom to discuss matters and options around our first services back. The thinking is that a recommendation would go from this meeting to the 25 June Church Council meeting.

You are most welcome to be part of this conversation. Worship Ministry Area discussions are open to everyone passionate about the growth of our worshipping life.
