

## From our recent Stewardship focus, the following is a reflection on what it may mean to live as God's fruitful people.

In the reading this week from Isaiah 5:1-7, the theme of fruitfulness is present. I began to wonder: Is fruitfulness the same as 'having success'?

As a side note, I would say fruitfulness isn't the same as giftedness. It's different to having certain skills and passions. Fruitfulness relates to the effective use our gifts.



But, is fruitfulness different to success? I guess it depends how we define success.

Couldn't the same be said of fruitfulness?

What are we longing to be fruitful in? How are we desiring to be fruitful?

More than 'how' do we define fruitfulness, is the question of 'who' defines fruitfulness for us?

Let's go one step further: will Christ say to us, once we've finished running our race in this lifetime, 'well done, good and *fruitful* servant'? How then does fruitfulness align with faithfulness?

In a Lost Sheep story about vines and grapes, <u>Basil the Branch</u> tries his best to produce fruit, but always comes up short trying to put all his effort into the end of his branch. He finally succeeds but only wh en he changes his focus, placing his attention and energy onto the Vine (God). *Et voila*: a big bunch of juicy grapes when the season arrives! (There's another factor to consider: is it the season for fruiting?)

So, all of this makes me think that our definitions of success, fruitfulness, and faithfulness depend on where our attention lies. If it is placed with God, then our lives will be slowly shaped into a community that values God's Love and Way. And maybe that's what it means to be fruitful as God intends?
