# Rev David Fender's Message

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" (Psalm 133:1)

The words of the Psalmist are so true, and we are seeing that lived out in our congregation at the moment. This year we have had a number of gatherings (New Year's day picnic,



combined service, congregational meeting, Lent studies, Ash Wednesday service, How will we sing the Lord's song in this land?) and I have been excited (but not surprised) that at every one of these we have seen people from each of our communities. # **Ministry Team Update**

#### **Rev Esteban Lievano**

The Uniting Church takes seriously our commitment to be a place where all people, including children and the vulnerable are kept safe. One tangible expression of this is that all Ministry Agents are required to hold a current blue card. This is also a legal requirement from the State Government. Due to an administrative oversight in the Synod office, Esteban Lievano's blue card will expire on Tuesday 3 March. Consequently, he will be unable to undertake any ministry duties until his card is renewed. It is expected that he will be absent for up to 10 days.

There is no suggestion that Esteban is unsuitable to work with children. However, legally he is unable to work.

Until Esteban returns to ministry duties, Rev David MacGregor will provide pastoral care to the members of the Mt Gravatt community. Other members of our ministry team and congregation will replace Esteban. If you are unsure of who to contact in place of Esteban, please contact myself or our church office.

The Church Council spent time reminding ourselves that the Church Council "... is responsible for building up the Congregation in faith and love, sustaining its members in hope, and leading them into a fuller participation in

Christ's mission in the world." (Basis of Union). We will be diligent in this task, focusing on leading our congregation in God's mission. To maintain this focus, the Church Council has delegated many operational responsibilities to our Ministry Areas. There is still opportunity to be involved in a Ministry Area. If you'd like to serve in that way, please contact the relevant Ministry Agent.

We also committed ourselves to being involved in a coaching partnership for the next two years, called Building a Discipling Culture (BDC). Those who follow Jesus are called disciples. As disciples, we are constantly called into a deeper relationship with Jesus and on that journey, we are called to be disciples who make other disciples. BDC helps us shape the culture of our congregation to one where discipling is primary and away from maintenance of what we have. Similar to the frog in the boiling water, it is a subtle transformation that takes place over time.




Reflect on the Nature of Temptation in the light of the gospel as we journey through some Old Testament readings and touch on Jesus' own

#### Brigades start year in Style



On Friday 21<sup>st</sup> February, the Brigades headed to Mt Gravatt church to take part in their annual enrolment/ dedication service. It's a time when the Boys and Girls (young men and women) acknowledge their responsibilities to each other as Brigade members, to their Company and to God as they begin a new year in Brigade. And along with their parents, their leaders and support team, they all committed to their respectful involvement and participation in Brigade for the coming year.

Once again Richard captivated all with his devotion before we moved to commission a new Boys' Brigade captain (Darryl Jell) and the respective Chaplains (Richard and Kylie Moors). David Fender reminded us that the Brigades as organisations do not exist for themselves but for the Church - the Body of Christ.
