Preparing for worship...

BEFORE you watch, spend a few minutes to settle yourself into a comfortable space.

Practice Box Breathing: Breathe in for 4 seconds; hold for 4; breathe out for 4; hold for 4; repeat.

While you breathe, remember that the word for 'Spirit' in Greek and Hebrew is also the word for 'breath'.

Our breathing is an act of prayer, worship, and praise. The Breath is itself connection to God, the Divine.

Reflection

Productivity and efficiency. We could make an argument that these are the dominant values we aspire to Australian society.

Are we working and behaving in ways that produce desirable outcomes, and are we doing this in a way that limits waste?

In such a climate, it's understandable that we can turn inward and look at all the ways we do not live up to this lofty, unrealistic, and unhealthy standard. Others will turn outward and begin the chase to become both productive and efficient, perhaps achieving a degree of competence in either or both. Does this lead to a satisfying and fulfilling life?

Love never ends.

But as for

prophecies...

tongues...

knowledge...

it will come

to an end.

1 Cor 13:8

Here is a moment to reflect on how we engage with the question of our *God-given giftedness*. God is not concerned with productivity or efficiency. Read the Parable of the Seed and Sower again, and ask yourself if either of these values are at the forefront of the mind of Sower (Mark 4:1-9).

The apostle Paul reminds us that the engine-room of our gifts and the ministry we offer through them is Love. It is not the outcomes as such that we do or don't achieve by them. It is enough to *offer* our Godgifted lives in love to others. This doesn't mean we disregard the outcome of the *offer*, because it could provide a clue to any deceit we carry – for example, our service to others may be masking our attempt to 'be a good person', when our better action is to reconnect meaningfully with God who alone is good.

Love is the Divine Energy that will never die, nor end. In order to live in this Love, through our *God-given gifts*, we must allow our egoic and self-serving desires to 'die' so that we might 'live' in God (where our identity, purpose and meaning are grounded in God's cosmic-sized life). This happens when we regularly choose to intentionally and humbly connect with God.

Take some time to connect with God through prayer, and/or take yourself to a place where you know you strongly connect with God. May God's peace and joy be with you.
