MESSAGE FROM PS RICHARD MOORS

So, we are up to thesis 7 from Dietrich Bonhoeffer. He says: "It may well be that the youth do have the right to protest against their elders. If that be the case, however, the authenticity of such protest will be demonstrated by youth's willingness to maintain solidarity with the guilt of the church-community and to bear that burden in love, abiding in penitence before God's Word."

Our natural thought sometimes is that young people don't fully understand issues, and so they may say things, but as they grow older they will learn the truth. In this way we can sometimes set ourselves up to ignore the challenges from the youth. Think about the demonstrations of school children this year, particularly around climate change. We have a choice to see this as a prophetic voice of the young, or as trouble-makers just seeking a day off school. (Yes, that is over simplifying responses.)

We need to think about how we allow space for our young people to speak into the church, to express how they feel about what we are doing. To give us a prophetic message when they see that things need to change.

You might hear people say, "The youth are the church of tomorrow." We need to remember that is not true, they are part of the church today, and we need to listen to their voice and be open for when they might correct us.

CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE

The Southside Church Council met on Tuesday 10 December.

We asked ourselves what the single most important thing that Southside Uniting Church should pursue in 2020. We recognise that there are many very important priorities that the church always faces and for particular seasons. Asking this question does not distract from this, but it focusses the attention of every member on a common goal. Our initial thinking is that we need to embrace the new beginnings that lie before us as a congregation. New beginnings both in terms of becoming aware and understanding the emerging culture of our neighbourhoods and how we best engage in mission. Also new beginnings as we develop the grace filled rhythms of working together as one congregation in multiple places. The church council will be praying and reflecting on this over the Christmas break before me meet again in January. Please be in prayer with and for them.

We made significant decisions about the shape of our ministry team. Each of our ministry team members have a specialist congregation wide ministry focus and some of us have responsibility as community ministers. The allocation of roles is below:

David Fender Lead Minister and Minister for Spiritual Growth

David MacGregor Minister for Worship and Pastoral Care and Tarragindi Community

Esteban Lievano Minister for Outreach and Mt Gravatt Community

Jock Dunbar Minister for New Missions Initiatives and Holland Park Community

Peter Elliott Minister for Yeronga Community and undertaking some projects

Rachel Manton Resources Manager

Richard Moors Children, Youth and Families Pastor

Jock is currently offering supply ministry. He has been extended until 30 June 2020. The process has commenced to call a new minister to the congregation. Recognising that Peter will be leaving sometime, the new minister will serve as community minister for both the Yeronga and Holland Park communities. It does not flow naturally from this decision that the service times of Yeronga or Holland Park will be changing. Arrangements will be made to allow worship to continue at 9 am in both communities.

Rachel Manton has also been extended as Resources Manager until 3 April 2020. We are currently working on the position description and hope to be able to advertise soon.

There are Uniting Church requirements relating to filling both the vacant ministry placement and the Resources Manager role. We can't simply appoint Jock and Rachel to these roles. However, they are both able to be considered.

We are considering designs for branding to identify our new congregation. We have a temporary logo. Stay tuned in the new year for our new look.
