Rev David Fender's Message

As the end of the year draws near, coinciding with the conclusion of my time at Southside, I've been reflecting on what we have achieved this year. And Southside, we have a lot to celebrate.

In a year that has continued to be fraught by COVID, we have continued to offer worship, pastoral care and our regular fellowship and outreach groups. We have reintroduced morning teas and maintained our relational connections. This alone has involved a great commitment from you. For instance, we have over 100 people who appear on our worship rosters and over 30 people actively serving as pastoral carers.

Yet, we have not just maintained what we have. In many ways we have entered into the new future that we intended when we came together as Southside.

Our Mission Experiment Group (MEG) has established a new initiative called New Friends. Here they gather Cultural and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) women to build friendships. New Friends have had 3 gatherings this year and have drawn in leadership from outside our congregation.

A group of us have continued to participate in the Building a Discipling Culture (BDC) movement. This is establishing the framework to help us be more intentional in being disciples who make disciples. We have also established a second huddle (learning and practicing group).

A young families pastorate (mid-sized group) has been established. This group meets monthly for a meal, fellowship, prayer and bible study.

Through our initiatives in Family faith formation the home environment and the primary role of parents and grandparents has continued to be emphasised. Our youth and children's activities have been shaped in a way that supports what happens in the home.

A group of people have intentionally been praying for some of the children in our congregation throughout the year.

We are progressing toward opening our Op Shop. Our Holland Park centre is a buzz of activity during the week, and we have held 4 garage sales (with one more due before the end of the year). The Op Shop is a great opportunity for us to turn strangers into friends and to serve our local neighbourhood.

Not without a lot of careful thought, we have taken the big and painful step of selling the property at Holland Park Central. This has been something that weighed heavily on the previous Holland Park congregations for many years.

Subject to the successful settlement, and endorsement by the congregation at the meeting on Sunday 12 December, the church council is planning to purchase a block of flats that can be used to address in a very small way, issues of housing affordability in our area.

Regular Men's Breakfasts and Women's Morning Teas have taken place to build relational connections across our newly formed congregation.

You may have been aware of some, all or none of this. Some of these initiatives are only in their early steps and there is very little to be seen yet. In other areas we are seeing a great ground swell of engagement and excitement. These initiatives are possible though because we together are Southside. In everything that I have listed above there are people from all (or most) of our communities engaged. There is nothing above that any of our previous congregations could've achieved alone. Together there is strength. I love being in meetings where I hear people from different communities share their thoughts on how things should be done. There is respect, understanding and creativity. There becomes the potential for added energy and new ways. And this is all for the future benefit and growth of Southside.

I often think of a quote "All change looks like failure in the middle." When we look at what we have lost, and I acknowledge that for many of you feelings of loss, grief and disconnection are real, we can see that we might have been better not amalgamating. At the same time I am convinced that you are on a journey toward a brighter future. As you wait for that future to dawn, I encourage you to continue to seek God, to look toward each other and be filled with the hope of God who knows the plans he has for you. Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

Thank you for trusting me to lead you into this future over the past 3 years.
