Update on Joint Nominating Committee (JNC) Process

The February meeting of the Church Council endorsed the Congregational Profile and the Position Description for the Senior Minister. These documents were approved by the South Moreton Presbytery Pastoral Relations Committee as being appropriate to forward to the Synod Placements Committee.

The process of call involves the following steps:

- Seeking approval from Placements to advertise the position. (Completed)
- All applications go to the Placements Secretary. (Applications close on March 20th 2023)
- Placements Secretary and chair of JNC then shortlist the applicants to three persons.
- JNC then interviews those three persons.

The elected Southside members of the JNC are Beth Bolt, Bronwyn Boyce, Janelle Cliff, Rod Hurman, Paul McDonald and Ryan Robertson. The South Moreton Presbytery Pastoral Relations Committee appoints 2 people to the JNC, one of whom is the Chair.

Once the members of the JNC receive the names of applicants, the process is confidential, and congregation members should not receive any information until an applicant has been selected, at which stage a Congregational meeting will be called...

Good News Story

World Day Report

Southside members attended two World Day of Prayer services this year. Here are the reflections from those attending. Thank you to Malcolm Jones and Jennifer Pengelly who wrote their reflections.

St Matthew's Anglican Church, Holland Park

An ecumenical World Day of Prayer service was held at St Matthews Anglican Church Holland Park on 3 March and was well attended with representatives from the local Anglican, Catholic, Lutheran and Uniting Churches [including SSUC]

The special focus of the day was the nation of Taiwan, and its women & people generally. A keynote address was given by director- general Edward Tao [the Taiwanese consul general in Brisbane} who shared very valuable insights into Taiwan. Mr Tao said that the war between the Ukraine and Russia reminds us that the conflict between western democracies and authoritarian states is far from over. People should not take freedom in all its forms for granted. Taiwan is on the front line of the clash between civilisations, and needs our prayers and support. Please do not forget Taiwan and pray for peace.

Annerley Church of Christ

World Day of Prayer for the Annerley, Yeronga, Moorooka and Tarragindi area was held at Annerley Church of Christ. Churches in attendance were Annerley Church of Christ, Annerley Baptist, St Luke's Anglican Church Ekibin, St Brendan's Catholic Church Moorooka, and SSUC Tarragindi & Yeronga.

Unfortunately this year there were only 21 people in attendance including 3 men, a number of our regular people were not available to attend. The offering was \$317.

This years' service was written by the Women of Taiwan during Covid, it is always good to read the country's back ground and history. Their topic was "I have heard about your Faith"

A Taiwanese woman from the Church of Christ who was born and bred in Taiwan, made tradition food to share and supplied flags for decoration. She also said the Lord's Prayer in Mandarin.

The Guest speaker was Glynthea Finger a retired minister and a missionary for the Church of Christ. She visits Salzburg in Austria regularly on mission work. Her talk was on the topic "I have heard about your Faith" and she expanded on the five women's stories which were featured in the Service. She also reflected on how hymns and songs can reflect the different stages of your life.

Next years' service is written by the women of Palestine and the theme will be "Bear one another in Love." A lovely time was shared by all who attended.

Did you know:-

- 1. Taiwan is half the size of Tasmania with about the same population as Australia;
- 2. It is home to a native Austronesian population, of the same stock as the polynesians [and Taiwan is believed to be the ancestral homeland of the Polynesians];
- 3. Taiwan is the 7th largest trading partner of Australia & the 6th largest for Qld [and is the largest maker of computer semi-conductors];
- 4. Qld has a very large Taiwanese presence of about 45,000 people;
- 5. The main religions are Buddhism and Taoism; but about 5% of the population are Christian [about 1 million people], with half being protestant and half being catholic. Christians have had a large[role in shaping Taiwan with several past presidents being Christian [including Chian Kai-shek and his son] and with Christians founding some of the large hospitals and education facilities;
- 6. China outnumbers the population of Taiwan by 1.4 billion to 23 million, and the Chinese military outnumbers the Taiwanese by more than 10 to one; and Taiwan sees itself in a david and goliath struggle;
- 7. The official name of Taiwan is the Republic of China and their government was established in 1912 on the mainland, but fled to Taiwan in 1949 after losing a civil war with the communists. Sections of the Taiwanese government have never abandoned heir claims to be the rightful government of china which annoys the communist government of the peoples republic of china [who considers Taiwan a break away province] .But Communist china has never ruled over Taiwan.
- 8. At present tensions with china are very high with daily incursions by the Chinese military into Taiwanese air space and territorial waters. The situation between Ukraine and Russia resonates strongly with the Taiwanese people who see themselves in a similar perilous situation, located next door to an aggressive expansionist neighbour. In fact China tried twice in the 1960s to invade by force but were repulsed;




move and looks really well. Seini, Sioeli and Michael are settling well into their schools, making friends and understanding how things are done there.
