As a new year starts, and in particular a new year as Southside Uniting Church, I want to ask you how you're managing your time and commitments and whether there is something that you need to do about it.



A saying that I often share with people is that we are to do all that God calls us to do and no more and no less.

Passages such as 1 Corinthians 12 teach us that we each have a part to play in the life of the church. Each act of service is equally valuable and necessary, but we are not all able to contribute to the same extent. It's about finding the sweet spot of serving where God has equipped and called us to be. Sometimes we do more than this, and we end up overworked, stressed, tired and resentful. Good News Story

Kairos Prison Ministry Australia

Kairos Prison Ministry Australia is an interdenominational Christian



ministry reaching out to incarcerated individuals, their families and those who work with them; to bring sustainable meaning and hope in the place of loneliness, isolation and despair. From 30 December to 3 January, 2 members of our congregation, Dick Copland and Bill Elliott, joined 12 others in running a course inside Wolston Correctional Centre.

The team was blessed through things such as all members receiving their security clearances and their gear and equipment entering the prison without a hitch. The prison staff were helpful and friendly, and they were supported by the prison chaplain.

During the week, the team and eighteen residents worked through a series of carefully designed activities which included meditations, lots of singing, talks, posters, discussions, listening, and prayers.

Several of the residents had medical conditions, and many were struggling with personal issues. Most had some understanding of Christianity.

The changes that occurred in the residents during the week were profound. Men who were reluctant to talk or communicate at the beginning of the week gained in confidence and peace. There was a lot of laughter and fun. It was wonderful to see how the residents responded to the caring nurture by the team. Some team members were changed too.

On Wednesday, there was a forgiveness ceremony where everyone compiled a list of those they needed to forgive (sometimes including themselves). These lists were then shredded. Later, the residents received letters in special sacks. Each team member wrote a personal letter to each resident. As well, residents received a number of community letters. These were the only letters some residents received. Wednesday afternoon was an emotional experience for many.

One of the outstanding features of the course was the way the men were able to pray for each other. Hopefully, Kairos graduates will be able to form share and care groups within their units.

The course could not have been run without the green servants. These were graduates from previous Kairos courses. Four were rostered on each day. These guys were amazing. They set up the chapel and conference room, helped with morning and afternoon teas as well as lunch. More importantly, they acted as mentors to the course participants. They were a wonderful support to the inside team as well.

This Kairos course will be followed up with monthly reunions where all graduates still in prison from all 10 Kairos courses held at Wolston are welcome. The first reunion was held on the 4th of January. 31 guys attended. These guys are actually forming a church within Wolston.

Please pray for the Christians in prisons who live out their faith in difficult conditions.

Many answers to prayer were seen during the week. This is not surprising as over 600 people were praying for Kairos Wolston number 10, including members of our congregation. Dick Copland
