MESSAGE FROM REV DAVID FENDER

The church council met on Tuesday 26 November. The work of the church council is vitally important in the forming of our new identity. I deeply appreciate the commitment that members are giving to the role on this church council, given that it is in addition to their existing roles on the separate church councils.

Thank you to those who participated in the survey for our new name. We had 158 response and 58% of these chose the name Southside Uniting Church. Additionally,



139 of the 158 responses chose Southside Uniting Church as one of their top three preferences. I think that you'll agree that this reflects a resounding affirmation for the name. We are now in the process of creating a logo to go with the new name. This logo will include the UC symbol to identify our congregation as part of the Uniting Church.

The church council also spent time considering the budget for 2020. My thanks go to Dave Allen (Mt Gravatt), Paul McDonald (Tarragindi), John Newman (Yeronga) and Rachel Manton (Resources Manager) for their dedicated work over the past weeks to pull together financial information from the four congregations, to create three possible scenarios for the church council to consider. Each of these scenarios needed to balance ministry and mission needs with a finite amount of money. Consequently, each of the scenarios involved a deficit, which can be supported for a short time by our substantial financial reserves. In deciding to recommend a deficit budget the church council was mindful of the reason we are coming together is to grow the mission of the congregation. It was thought best that to do this would be to invest wisely in our capacity to grow and incur a short-term deficit. This was opposed to having a balanced budget which severely limits our capacity to invest in opportunities to grow. This is not a long-term strategy. The ability of the congregation to balance its budget must be addressed within the next couple of years. At this stage we do not have final figures so I'm unable to share this with you. A copy of the proposed budget will be presented for approval at our first congregational meeting on 9 February 2020.

I am also excited that the church council approved an exciting missional initiative for 2020. We will be engaging the services of Phil McCredden to lead us in becoming aware and understanding the nature and context of our neighbourhoods and then helping us to create flexible and low risk experiments to serve and connect with people. The aim is to share the story of Jesus and our faith with our neighbours in ways that make sense to them. Please start to pray for this initiative and consider whether God might be prompting you to be part of this new thing that he's doing.

As we move into the season of Advent, we are reminded of the time that the Israelites went through waiting for the coming of the Messiah and the two thousand years that the church has been waiting for Christ to come again. Waiting can be a time of frustration "just hurry up and come"!! It can also encourage us to become

MESSAGE FROM PS RICHARD MOORS

Bonhoeffer's 6th theses on youth ministry says: "Church youth work is possible only on the basis of addressing young people concerning their baptism and with the exclusive goal of having them hear God's Word. It remains the act of the church-community toward its members. Every transgression of this boundary constitutes a betrayal of Christ's church-community."

Again, we see his focus upon the church community as being the centre. Our role in ministry with young people is to help young people understand their baptism and understand how to hear God's Word. Yes, indeed this will mean that sometimes they will need to have special classes to unpack the Bible at a level which is appropriate for them. But that is not all we are to do with our young people. If the young are only in their age appropriate class, then for Bonhoeffer that is a betrayal of the church-community. Remember for him the church gathered is where we truly experience Jesus, and if the young people are not part of this, then it is a betrayal.

Note therefore that the role of ministry with young people is an act of the church community. It is not just the paid youth worker, or the leaders of children/youth ministry. The ministry to young people is the role of the whole church. Whether that is getting alongside the young people and hearing their story. Whether it is simply greeting them and helping them to feel welcomed. Whether it is being flexible to allow them in the church service and for their needs to be met. We need to remind ourselves it is only in the last hundred years that young people have been taken out of church services, prior to that they were part of the whole of the service. I would suggest that we need to regain some of that.


